

PSAT READING & RHETORIC CLASS

The new SAT has less vocabulary and no guessing penalty...but far more scientific writing. - One 30-minute private writing consultation with the instructor at the course's conclusion.

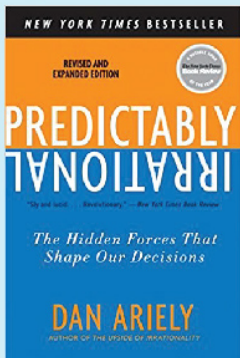
